We continue to fund behaviour management and participation support to allow our pupils to complete work in a supportive environment. They benefit from the completion of restorative justice tasks and develop interpersonal and social skills. Pupil participation support sessions with our most vulnerable pupils are arranged with our pupil participation assistant to support and develop confidence leading to improvements in attendance, reduced behaviours and achievement.
